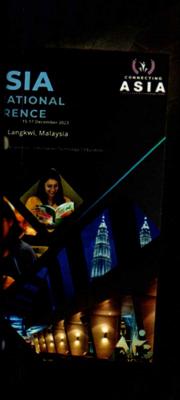

Abstract: The Effectiveness of Bumdes in Indonesia and the Role of Women in Leadership. According to data from the Central Statistics Agency (BPS), Indonesia's population, which will total 278.69 million by the middle of 2023 and consist of half women, is still lagging behind in a number of key sectors that affect national productivity. The UN General Assembly adopted the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in place of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and the Planet 50 agenda, which calls for the achievement of 50 gender-inclusive characteristics by 2030, as a result of the equal underdevelopment of women in all countries and geographical areas. Important and historical events are significantly impacted by issues with leadership. A focus has been placed on the issue of leadership itself. Since the topic of leadership has generated interest so far, it is clear that it is still worth researching, particularly with regard to women, who still make up a minor portion of Indonesian culture. One of the top priorities of the Ministry of Villages, Development of Disadvantaged Regions, and Transmigration (Kemendes PDTT) is village-owned enterprises (BUM Desa/Bumdes). In order to coincide with the passage of Law Number 6 of 2014 concerning villages, the government first introduced the BUMDes initiative in 2014. Due to its broad scope to enhance communal welfare, this BUMDes program is anticipated to become a great program for every village. What is in focus is the significant role BUMDes have played in spreading throughout Indonesia and operating their programs. BUMDes have established themselves in Indonesia and are carrying out their programs, but what is drawing attention is the significant contribution that women's leadership has made to raising the efficacy of BUMDes in Indonesian villages and accelerating the conversion of those villages into independent villages as a whole.

AIC-2023-GDHEC-95: HOW DOES PSYCHOSOCIAL SAFETY CLIMATE AFFECT WORK-RELATED OUTCOMES AMONG EMPLOYEES? THE CASE OF MALAYSIAN MULTINATIONAL CORPORATIONS

Abstract: In contemporary workplaces, employees of Malaysian multinational corporations (MNCs) are grappling with heightened levels of burnout, stemming from elevated job demands coupled with insufficient job resources. Recognizing this, the present research endeavors to scrutinize the factors contributing to burnout among MNC employees. Additionally, the study aims to unravel the potential mediating influence of work engagement in this relationship. A cohort of 342 MNC employees participated in the empirical investigation. The findings of the study unveiled a significant negative association between psychosocial safety climate (PSC) and burnout, as well as between work engagement and burnout. Intriguingly, work engagement emerged as a crucial mediator in the relationship between PSC and burnout. This research contributes valuable insights for both academic scholars and practitioners involved in the management of burnout among MNC employees. The implications of the study extend to the development of targeted interventions and strategies aimed at enhancing psychosocial safety climates and promoting work engagement as integral components of holistic burnout prevention initiatives within multinational corporate settings.
